As I write this to the sound of rumbling thunder, the rain is pattering against the window, rain that is welcome and refreshing during these long, hot summer days. I gaze at the weather app on my phone, and sure enough, the heat and humidity will return soon. Unlike some, I do not welcome this. But I have no choice in the matter, short of relocating to the northern reaches of Canada or perhaps the state of Alaska. In the same way, those who hate the winter's cold and snow have no choice but to bear it, or attempt to escape it by heading south. Yes, man, for all his pomp and arrogance, has no control over the weather.

There are some things we *can* choose. We *can choose* where to live. We *can choose* whether to have pepperoni or mushrooms on our pizza. We *can choose* what color shirt to put on for the day. **But some things we cannot choose**. For example, we *can choose* whether or not to attend a Tiger baseball game, but *we cannot choose* to make the Tigers win. That is not in our power.

Think about this. **What does it mean to be pro-choice?** Well, it depends. Pro-choice *in what*? If it means the right for parents to choose what type of education is best for their children – which school, whether public, private, charter, or homeschool – that is a *good* thing. **Parents** are the legitimate authorities over their children. They – *and not the State* – have the calling from God to determine what is best for their children, as well as the charge to bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

But that is not the main way the phrase "pro-choice" is used today, is it? We all know what it means to be pro-choice. It

Anthony Esolen, in one of his poems, writes:

That was when Israel swarmed with evil,

Feeding children through fire to Molech,

While they shook their tambourines to drown the cries.

Nowadays, instead of Molech, we sacrifice our children to the altar of *"CHOICE."* But let's be clear on what *"pro-choice"* means. Choice of *what*?

If a choice has no actual moral significance, like which pizza topping you choose, that is one thing. But there is great moral significance when it comes to the choice to end an innocent person's life.

Every life - created by God, redeemed by Christ - has immense value. Remember that, in this critical election year.

When someone says that they are *pro-choice*, we have to ask, what is that choice *between*? In the case of the current abortion debate, it is used to defend the choice to kill a baby, rather than let that baby live and be born. That is a denial of the basic human right to life of the unborn child. That *cannot* be good.

God, of course, can choose whatever He wants. God is God. He *alone* is the Author and Giver of life. No human being has the right to question His will. But though God can choose to do anything He wishes, He acts according to His nature. *God is just*, and must therefore punish sin. *But God is also love* and thus desires our eternal salvation. That justice and that love come together in one place – *THE CROSS*. Jesus, God's own Son, took the punishment for sin – *our sin* – and we are forgiven. God loves us in Christ. We are His people. We have been rescued.

Sadly, many people have abandoned any belief in God, or at least in the true God of the Bible. If there is no God, *then human life is cheap*. We are just freak accidents of an evolutionary enigma, with no real purpose to our existence, and thus no absolute morals of right or wrong, good or evil. In a godless universe, man is nothing more than a bag of chemicals. **Dr. Rodney Brooks**, with a PhD in computer science from Stanford, says: *"A human being is nothing but a machine or a big bag of skin full of biomolecules interacting by the laws of physics and chemistry."* Of course, this begs the question of who designed those laws of physics and chemistry in the first place!

We know better. Human beings are *far more* than big bags of skin filled with biomolecules. *"Then God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. And God blessed them." (Genesis 1)*

Do not think that you can sit this out on the fence, not when it comes to life and death issues such as abortion and euthanasia. As a Christian, **you cannot**. There is no grey area. You are either *for* God or *against* Him. And God is the God of Life. We are called to be those who promote and protect innocent human life. And, yes, that also means taking very seriously which candidates in every level of government will receive your vote. *Right To Life of Michigan* provides a helpful online guide to assist in knowing which candidates for each office are pro-life, or which ones openly support the killing of babies in abortion. *Check it out at <u>https://rtl.org/get-involved/elections/</u>.*

Well, the rain has stopped. I hear no more sound of thunder. The earth is refreshed with life. Crops grow, flowers bloom, cows graze, and man thrives in the world God has made, even though sin has altered that world greatly. Daily weather reminds us that *GOD*, not man, is in control. We can *choose* what clothes to wear, and what pizza topping to order, but we cannot select the weather, which is probably a good thing. We'd all disagree anyway.

But by God's grace, redeemed by Christ, and enlightened by the Holy Spirit, *LET US NOT CHOOSE moral and spiritual evil.* But as Scripture says in **Deuteronomy 30:19-20**: *"Therefore CHOOSE LIFE, that you and your offspring may live, loving the Lord your God, obeying His voice and holding fast to Him, for HE is your LIFE and length of days."* Amen.

Honoring Lucy Schilling on her 90th birthday July 15, 2024

Matthew 25:40 Jesus said," I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for Me."

Lucy has been a tireless advocate for many who some might consider "the least." While she and her husband Ray, a Lutheran teacher and librarian, lived in Chicago, they helped find homes for 200 Vietnamese families after the fall of Saigon. They themselves fostered two Vietnamese boys who were without parents in the USA. Then they opened their home to dozens of foreign exchange students.

Inspired by Dr. Dobson's horrific description of abortion and after viewing *Silent Scream*, they formed a Lutherans For Life group at St. John Lutheran Church in Forest Park. They organized prayer vigils outside abortion clinics.

Upon Ray's retirement, they moved to Fraser to be closer to their family. Lucy survived ovarian cancer and Ray struggled with Parkinson's disease, but their zeal for helping others never wavered. They visited nursing homes and assisted the pastors with worship services there, even as they had done in Chicago. Each August they were part of the Project Compassion group serving picnic lunches to inner city nursing homes.

Ray went home to heaven in May 2018, but Lucy continues to live in her own home and worship faithfully at St. John Lutheran Church in Fraser. She continues to advocate for Life both at St. John and at the local pregnancy center, Compassion Pregnancy.

May God bless Lucy! What an example of God's boundless love for others! Happy Birthday, Lucy!

Everywhere we look these days we see conversations politicized. Reasoned argument is skipped in the effort to discern what an author's political opinions really are, and whether they accord with what they *should* be. The Left and Right collide, hurling slogans at each other, often baiting and belittling the other to advance their own agendas. Throughout vast regions of academia, power has seemingly replaced reason, with all thinking now being understood ideologically.

But while people on opposite ends of the political spectrum organize to persuade, they eschew the less glamorous task of *analysis*. However, for conversation to proceed rationally, presuppositions from each side must be examined calmly, and words must be understood properly. Analysis can allow disputants to become conversation partners, for common ground can often be found where none seemed possible before.

Verba Vitae is committed to bringing the classical Christian tradition into conversation with life issues now confronting us. Modeling the reasoned *logos* of the theological tradition, *Verba Vitae* explores the truth-claims made by thinkers and examines the grounds upon which these assertions are made. It is interested in what is being talked about when thinkers employ the language of rights and goods, or when thinkers speak of God. It is accordingly interested in fostering and modeling *informed* conversation. How do people talk to each other respectfully when holding differing conceptions of the good?
